The population's satisfaction level with the electronic services provided by the Swiss authorities at 71% is high - higher than in Germany and on a par with Austria (2018 eGovernment Monitor).

18. What percentage of your GDP is allocated for ICT investment in the public sector?

In 2015, 19 % of business investments in Switzerland was attributed for ICT. This rate is higher in the services sector (22%) than in construction (15%) and in industry (13%) (measured in 2015).
